The charter reads in part: ***** Bringing together representatives of the entire stakeholder community - people with different backgrounds, different needs, different approaches, from different locations around the world - to collaborate on an open protocol is the most reliable way to produce solutions that are cost-effective, diverse, comprehensive, innovative, and scaled to meet the aggressive EV growth strategies. ***** OK, but I assume this type of information interchange is already happening. Yes? That is between "Charge Point Owners" and "Central Management System Suppliers."	OCPP is the most common open specification world wide. Information exchange is accomplished with OCPP or a variety of proprietary protocols. Major organizations using proprietary protocols have been invited to participate by the first meeting. People interested in the open OCPP specification have since October 2015 downloaded the most recent version, OCPP 1.6, over 5000 times from 78 different countries. The initial members of the TC will be determined by signups prior to the first meeting on September 7, 2016. Among the co-conveners there are companies with presence in the US, Europe, including both global charge point (EVSE) manufacturers and charging services providers. The charge point owner has ownership rights to the physical charge point station.

The TC focus is on globally used standards, not only the United States. Many RFPs worldwide and in the US call for OCPP support. The initial members of the TC are not known; the set of initial members is determined by responses to the Call for Participation prior to the first meeting on September 7, 2016. Among the co-conveners there are companies with presence in the US, Europe, and Asia, including both global charging station equipment (EVSE) manufacturers and charging services providers.
