Thank you for your continued dedication to advancing open standards and open source projects. Your collective efforts strengthen our mission and expand our impact across industries and communities everywhere. This past year once again showed the remarkable power of open collaboration -- and the difference we can make together.

We celebrated major milestones that demonstrate the lasting global influence of our work. The 25th anniversary of the Message Queuing Telemetry Transport (MQTT) and the 20th anniversary of the Common Alerting Protocol (CAP) each mark decades of real-world impact. MQTT enables reliable, efficient communication for billions of connected devices, while CAP continues to serve as a vital global standard for emergency alerts, protecting lives and strengthening community resilience.

Innovation continues to drive our progress. The launch of the Coalition for Secure AI (CoSAI), an OASIS Open Project, brought together leading organizations to define best practices and security frameworks for the responsible development and deployment of artificial intelligence. With strong participation and four active workstreams, CoSAI is already gaining momentum in shaping the future of secure AI.

We also expanded our community's reach with the formation of two new Technical Committees. The Open Supply-Chain Information Modeling (OSIM) Technical Committee defines models for exchanging critical software supply chain data, while the Space Automated Threat Intelligence Sharing (SATIS) Technical Committee strengthens cyber threat response capabilities for the rapidly growing space sector. These initiatives show how OASIS continues to lead in emerging technology domains.

Celebrating excellence within our community is something I look forward to each year. The Open Cup awards honored outstanding technical achievements, including the Outstanding New Initiative award presented to CoSAI, and the Outstanding Approved Standard award presented to Universal Business Language (UBL) version 2.4 -- a widely adopted standard advancing interoperability and efficiency in global supply chains and digital trade.

We also recognized the extraordinary contributions of David Lemire, William Parducci, and Omar Santos as this year's OASIS Distinguished Contributors. Their leadership, expertise, and dedication embody the spirit of collaboration and innovation that defines our community.

I would also like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to our staff and recently retired colleagues for the invaluable role they have played in shaping and advancing OASIS's growth.

Looking ahead, we are preparing for a significant renewal of the core systems that have supported our community's collaboration and innovation over the past decades. This major upgrade will modernize our infrastructure, making it faster and easier for our members to connect, contribute, and advance their important work.

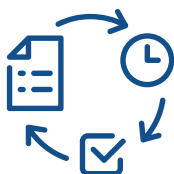

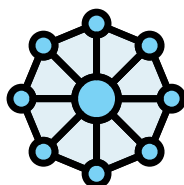

Almost all computer hardware and software developed around the world needs some documentation. For the most part, this documentation has a similar structure and a large core of common idioms. The community benefits from having a standard, open, interchangeable vocabulary in which to write this documentation. DocBook has been, and will continue to be, designed to satisfy this requirement. For more than 25 years, DocBook has provided a structured markup vocabulary for just this purpose. DocBook Version 5.2 continues the evolution of the DocBook XML schema.

UBL V2.4 is the leading interchange format for business documents, revolutionizing global business transactions with its latest version. The standard works seamlessly with frameworks like ISO/IEC 15000 (ebXML), extending the benefits of Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) systems to businesses worldwide. UBL V2.4 maintains backward compatibility with earlier V2.# versions while introducing new business document types, now totaling 93. The European Union has recognized UBL's significance by declaring it officially eligible for referencing in tenders from public administrations.

Milestone Anniversaries

In 2024, OASIS proudly recognized the 25th anniversary of Message Queuing Telemetry Transport (MQTT) and the 20th anniversary of the Common Alerting Protocol (CAP), two OASIS Standards that have made a lasting global impact.



MQTT has become a foundational protocol for the Internet of Things (IoT). Originally developed to enable low-bandwidth, real-time communication in constrained environments, MQTT is now widely used across industries, including manufacturing, energy, healthcare, and smart cities. Its lightweight, efficient, and reliable messaging capabilities have made it indispensable for connecting billions of devices, driving innovation in automation, remote monitoring, and secure data exchange in an increasingly connected world.

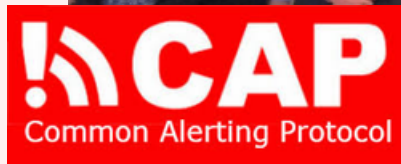

CAP is the global standard for emergency alerting. Adopted by governments, public safety agencies, and organizations worldwide, CAP enables the rapid and reliable dissemination of critical alerts across multiple communication systems, from sirens and radio broadcasts to mobile notifications. By ensuring interoperability and consistency in emergency messaging, CAP has played a vital role in safeguarding lives and property in the face of natural disasters, severe weather, and other emergencies. CAP celebrated its milestone anniversary at the annual CAP Workshop in Leuven, Belgium.

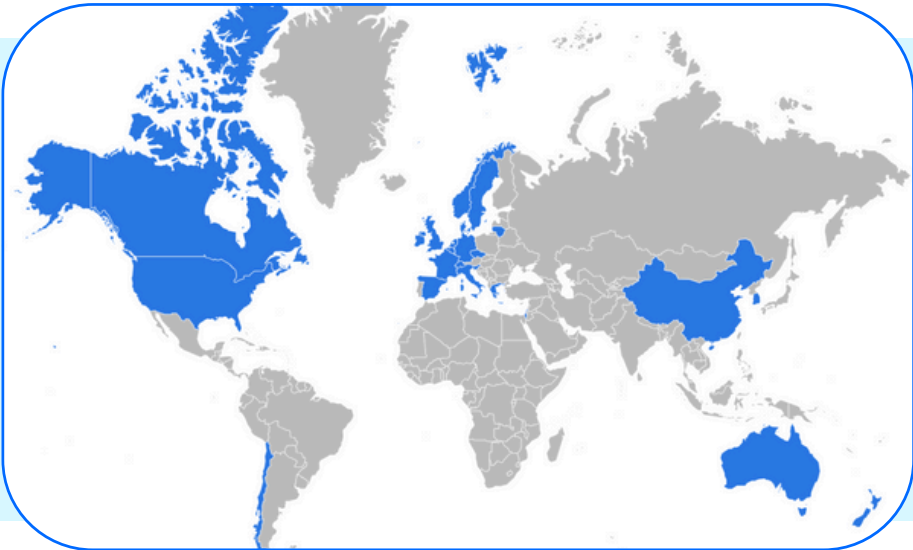

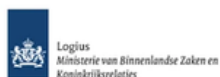
